Crafters' News

Felting—Boiled Wool

One of the techniques involved with wool yarn is felting or sometimes it is called boiled wool. This is the art of knitting with 100% wool and then putting it in very hot water in the washing machine and agitating it until it shrinks to the desired size. The item that is being felted uses a prescribed pattern that is much too large and then placed in the washer.

When I first started felting, my instructor said, "Do not walk away from the washing machine or you may end up with something way too small!" So far, I've always stayed right by the washer and haven't let anything lure me away.

Right now, I'm felting slippers. Since they have a double sole, they are very warm and cozy. People who complain that their floors are cold, really like them!


Another possibility for the December Christmas Social if you would like to add:




